Patrick has slammed Tory plans to build thousands of new homes near Churchill, Langford and Blagdon against residents' wishes.



New Transport plans unveiled

The new West of England Joint Transport plan has been published, with proposals for a new M5 junction, improvements to the motorway and local rail services and the Banwell bypass.

Some of these changes will be positive and help to reduce congestion, but proposed junction 21a is only proposed to support the development of the "Garden Village" in Churchill, while local residents are worried about the impact of new roads and the Banwell bypass on traffic flows in the villages.
